## HISTORY

Rammohan College owes its origin to City College, Calcutta, which is one of the oldest first grade colleges in West Bengal. It was founded in 1881 by a group of committed and self-less Brahmo leaders like Ananda Mohan Bose, Pandit Sivnath Sastri and Umesh Chandra Dutta. Rastraguru Surendranath Banerjee later joined the College as a teacher. City College had a Womens' Department in the morning. Due to UGC Regulations, the Womens' Department was separately affiliated as an independent college to Calcutta University in 1961, and was named after Raja Rammohan Roy, the chief architect of 19th Century Bengal Renaissance. Since then, Rammohan College is continuing its journey towards academic excellence.

## AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aim of the College, as enumerated by its founders, is to promote education in its highest and widest sense in a holistic manner, to girl students from all over the city, state and country. The objective of the college is to impart more than textbook oriented knowledge. It strives for empowerment of the girl student through value based teaching, dependence on rational thinking, self-reliant approach to life and a deep sense of responsibility towards society.

The institution is a dynamic entity, evolving with changing needs and readjusting structures and activities in response to time. Human values are prioritized and students are encouraged to gain confidence as they commit themselves to academic excellence.

## INFRASTRUCTURE

- a) Campus The College has two campuses. One in 102/1 Raja Rammohan Sarani, and New Science Building in 85A Raja Rammohan Sarani, Kolkata- 09. The department of Botany, Zoology, Physiology and Geography mostly function from the New Science campus. Information Technology classes are held for B.Com students in the IT Lab of the New Science Building. The New Science Building also hosts a seminar hall. The college has a 'Smart Classroom' facility. Addition of more such Smart Class Rooms are under progress. Plot nos. 85C and 85D Raja Rammohan Sarani, Kol- 09 has also been acquired by the college and awaits further development.
- b) Laboratories All science departments have well equipped laboratories in compliance with the University syllabus. The Department of Mathematics has a computer laboratory catering to their needs. The Post Graduate departments have facilities for research work.
- c) The College has a Medicinal Plant garden maintained by the Department of Botany and a Fish pond maintained by the Department of Zoology.

# STUDENT SUPPORT SYSTEM

### STUDENTS' HOSTEL

"Sadhana Sarkar Memorial Hostel" at 35, Avedananda Road, Kolkata 700 006, provides accommodation for bonafide students of Rammohan College.

It is a four storied building near Hedua swimming pool, accessible both from Bidhan Sarani and from Acharya Prafulla Chandra Road near Manicktala crossing. It has visitors' room, dining and assembly hall, study room, four and five bedded rooms and dormitories. Indoor games facilities are available

The hostel runs under the supervision of a hostel superintendent, a matron and other efficient staff members. A hostel committee sanctioned by the Governing Body of the college looks after the management and administration of the hostel. The committee includes representatives from the teaching, non-teaching, administrative staff and Governing Body members

A separate hostel prospectus is available. Bonafide college students intending to avail of the hostel facilities are to contact the office of the Principal at the time of admission.

### LIBRARY/SEMINAR LIBRARY AND BOOK BANK/BOOK STORE

The college library is well equipped with reference books on each subject, periodicals, magazines and academic journals of generalised and specialised interest. Teachers and students equally benefit from this library. A book bank under the UGC scheme is also available in the new science building.

- College Library is a member of N-LIST CONSORTIUM.
- Seminar libraries are there in all honours departments.

The Departmental Library:

Along with the central library, seminar libraries are also maintained by the various departments. The departmental libraries have been built to provide easy access to the students. The departmental libraries consist mainly of textbooks and a few reference books. Students can borrow books from the Departmental Library with the permission of the concerned teachers of the Department.

Working Hours of the Library:

06-30 a.m. to 11-30 a.m. (Monday to Saturday).

### **COMMON ROOM/CANTEEN**

The college has a spacious students common room equipped with indoor games. A pocket friendly canteen is available for the students within the college premises.

### GYMNASIUM

The Gymnasium of the college has been inaugurated by Sri Sudip Bandyopadhyay, Honourable M.P. and it has been opened for the students from the session 2016-2017. The gymnasium is well equipped and students have their practices under the guidance of a lady trainer.

### STUDENTS' AID FUND AND STUDENTS' HEALTH HOME

Needy, meritorious, enthusiastic students with genuine urge for learning are provided concessions in tuition fees, examination fees, book grants etc. as and where applicable. Good conduct and regular attendance are conditions to be fulfilled to avail of any aid. All students are members of Students' Health Home.

### **IDENTITY CARD**

The newly admitted students get an ID Card from the office after payment of ID Card Fee. Without an ID Card, they are not allowed to fill their registration forms, library card and C.U. examination forms. If the identity card is lost the students have to pay a fine of Rs. 100/- for a duplicate identity card. ID Card is also obligatory for the students during practical classes. During collection of final result and degree certificate, submission of ID Card is mandatory.

### COLLEGE MAGAZINES AND BULLETINS

The college magazine is published by the college at regular intervals. Articles, poems, stories in English, Bengali, Hindi are contributed both by the students and the teachers. Students of different

departments also publish wall magazines. Specific information and bulletins are also put up in the notice board. Our college magazine "Lekhalekhi" has been published in 2018.

### **ANNUAL SPORTS**

The annual sports of the college are generally held in December/ January. Students, teaching and non teaching staff of the college all participate in different events.

#### PRIZE/AWARD

Prizes are awarded on the basis of academic performances in the CU Examination, some special prizes are distributed among toppers of different departments.

#### RESERVATION

22% seats of each subject is reserved for SC category, 6% for ST category students, 2% for physically challenged students and 1% for sports persons who have represented State/National/International level. Reservation for OBC A & B students is maintained as per Govt order.

#### **GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL**

Students are to give in writing their specific complaints and drop it in the specified box outside the Principal's room. Besides this, the college also has an Anti Ragging Cell and an Internal Complaints Committee.

### ANTI RAGGING CELL

1. What is ragging?

Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or a junior student.

Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or related harm is termed as ragging. Asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student, among other things, is termed as ragging.

The action taken by the Government against the schools and colleges from where complaints in regard to ragging have been received and the details of such colleges during the said period; and UGC is taking actions as per the UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009. Details of the action taken to address the complaints is also available at the website www.antiragging.in & www.amanmovement.org The UGC has accorded top most priority to curtail the menace of ragging in institutions of higher education. The following measures have been undertaken by the UGC :-

a. A nationwide 24X7X365 toll free anti-ragging helpline

b. UGC has constituted Coordination Committee and Inter Council Committee for effective measures of anti-ragging in Higher Educational Institutions.

c. UGC regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009.

d. UGC (Promotion of equity), Regulations, 2012

e. Circulars and public notices have been issued to stop ragging in the institutions of Higher Education. The Higher Education institutions have been requested to organize debates etc. for controlling ragging in all its form. UGC has notified the UGC Anti Ragging Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009. The Commission has made it mandatory for all institutions to incorporate in their prospectus the directions of the Government regarding prohibition and consequences of ragging.

A nationwide toll free 24x7 anti ragging helpline 1800-180-5522 in 12 languages has been established which can be accessed by students in distress owing to ragging related incidents. UGC has also developed the Anti Ragging Mobile Application for filing the complaint on ragging, filing the affidavit and for calling the Toll Free Anti Ragging Helpline Number and the same may be downloaded from Google Play Store.

UGC has developed an Anti Ragging website Le. www.antiragging.in. The portal contains record of registered complaints received and the status of the action taken thereon. Secretary, UGC sends the circular twice a year regarding strict compliance of UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions. Details may please be seen at UGC website: www.ugc.ac.in From time to time the UGC has also issued Public Notice in leading national newspapers to spread awareness about ragging.

University Grants Commission has amended its anti ragging regulations to include physical or mental abuse on grounds of ethnicity, caste, religion, colour, regional background, linguistic identity, national and sexual orientation.

The 3rd Amendment of UGC Regulations on "Curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2016 according to this:

3(j) Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (Fresher or otherwise) on ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

### **PARENT-TEACHER MEETING**

All the departments of the college arrange meetings at regular intervals, 1g, before the Internal Assessment Examination of each semester.

### NSS

The National Service Scheme was started in 2006. The students of the College under NSS carry out various activities like plantation programs, welfare programs like distribution of clothes to the poor, providing books and financial aids to the students, celebrate 'World Environment Day', 'Human Rights Day', 'Women's Day', 'AIDS Day'. Taking part in such extra curricular activities helps shape their personalities, inspires them to be better citizens and encourages them to give back to the society. It has been received the following awards from University of Calcutta:

- 3. 2013: Best Volunteers

The College NSS unit organized Thalassemia awareness programme as well as blood group detection camp. In India Thalassemia is quite prevalent and the major reason for such high incidence is because very few women know that they are carriers. The awareness programme was an attempt to educate them about the need of getting tested.

The NSS Unit of Rammohan College celebrated 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign under the aegis of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav on 8th August, 2022. ## GENERAL RULES AND INSTRUCTIONS

### **APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION**

Admission into the Degree Course begins after the publication of HS. results. Application will be by online basis.

N.B.: SC/ST/OBC Reservation, Sports Quota & Physically Challenged Quota as per University rules.

### DOCUMENTS NECESSARY FOR ADMISSION

The application form must be accompanied by the following documents.

- Admit Card of the Class X School Leaving Examination or Age Proof
- Mark Sheet (Self Attested Photo Copy).
- SC/ST/OBC Certificate. B.P.L. Card Holder Certificate.
- Physically Challenged Certificate.
- Transfer Certificate & Registration Certificate in case of students from another college.
- Letter from the natural guardian appointing a local when the student will not live with parents.
- Migration Certificate is required in the case of a student passing from other State Boards.

N. B. Originals must be produced at the time of Admission.

Students of CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling need not submit a migration certificate.

Students are admitted provisionally pending post admission scrutiny of application forms. If any admission is obtained in violation of standing Rules and/or Procedures of admission of the Calcutta University and/or of the College for reasons whatsoever, admission is liable to be cancelled.

Students who join the college on migration from other state boards get themselves admitted after the last date of admission fixed by the University are reminded that their admission to this college is purely provisional. They are required to fill in necessary forms, submit requisite documents in support of their application, and pay the required fees immediately after admission, for transmission to the University.

### TRANSFER

Students once admitted will not be permitted to take transfer within the academic year provided:

She has paid all college dues till date and Transfer Fee of Rs. 700/- only. An application in duplicate for a Transfer Certificate must be made in writing by the applicant countersigned by her parent or guardian. ### **MODE OF PAYMENT OF FEES**

• Defaulters will stand the risk of losing the benefit of attendance in class. Students should be regular in payment of fees and dues to avoid fine provisions.

• All fees must be paid through the Fee Book. Students must preserve their Fee Books carefully as they will have to produce them whenever required. The fee book must be presented for claiming refund of any deposit/fees.

## DEPT. OF PHYSIOLOGY (P. G. SECTION)

The post graduate course in Human Physiology was started from the session 2006 2007 by the affiliation to C.U. Admission to this course becomes open after publication of the final result of B. Sc examination and it is according to C.U. regulation, i.e., 60% by merit list and 40% by entrance test since 2016-17. It is a day time course and is co-educational. The whole admission process is controlled by C.U. The P.G. Course is guided by the faculty of Physiology Department and guest lecturers of this and other institutions including universities colleges, research institutes etc.

According to the CU. norms, from the session 2014-15 the P. G course in Human Physiology" has been fully converted to a semester system which constitutes four semesters in two years. The fees for each semester are to be paid during admission and also to be paid during enrollment for the next semester accordingly.

A research unit has also been opened in the department. Six research scholars under Dr. Gouri Prosad Dutta, three scholars under Dr. Sahana Mazumdar (Convenor, Course Coordinator), and three scholars are conducting their research work under Dr. Samarendra Nath Banerjee.

The Dept. recently developed the PG library, Instrumentation facility cum research laboratory and one computer laboratory. For carrying out research on animals, there is an Institutional Animal Ethics Committee and an animal house, registered under CPCSEA Govt. of India.

### DEPT. OF BENGALI (P. G. SECTION)

The post graduate course in Bengali was started from the session 2014-2015 by the affiliation to C.U. Admission to this course becomes open after publication of the final result of B. A. examination and it is on merit basis. It is a day time course and is co-educational. 60% students from undergraduate colleges of C.U. will be directly admitted on merit basis. The remaining 40% students from undergraduate colleges of other universities will be admitted on the basis of entrance examination.

The P.G. Course is guided by faculty of Bengali Department and guest lecturers of this institution. The semester system in P. G. course has been introduced in the session 2014-15. According to CU. norms, the fees for each semester is Rs. 8,400/- to be paid during admission and also to be paid during enrolment for the next semester accordingly.

# THE RAJA RAMMOHAN ROY MEMORIAL MUSEUM

(A project being undertaken and developed by Rammohan College) Raja Rammohan Roy (1772-1833), the great scholar, thinker, reformer and a man with immense depth and breadth of vision,

attempted to inspire contemporary Indian society to adopt the path of modernism through mental and moral uplift of mankind. Rabindranath Tagore has said "Rammohan Roy inaugurated the Modern Age in India. Rammohan belongs to the lineage of India's great seers." In Tagore's opinion Rammohan was the only person in his time to realise completely the significance of the Modern Age.

The museum, the first ever and only one on Rammohan is located at the family residence of Rammohan at 85A, Raja Rammohan Sarani, Kolkata-9. The residence, a majestic building about 200 years old with attractive architecture of the early 19th century has been declared a 'Heritage Building by the Kolkata Municipal Corporation.

Rammohan College, acquired, renovated and restored the house from its ruins for the purpose of converting the building into Raja Rammohan Roy Memorial Museum with active support from the Govt. of West Bengal. The repair and renovation work has been done by the Department of PWD, Government of West Bengal.

A permanent exhibition on the eventful life, revolutionary ideas and pioneering works of Rammohan against the background of Western enlightenment was opened in 2000. The project was financed entirely out of donations received from generous people.

The Govt. of West Bengal and Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India, have rendered financial assistance for the promotion and development of the museum. The museum has also received financial support from M.P. Lad fund. Recently the museum has received Rs. 6 lakhs from Higher Education Department, Social Education Branch, Govt. of West Bengal for maintenance of the museum. Further a grant of Rs. 5 lakhs was received from Information & Cultural Affairs Dept., Govt. of West Bengal for setting up of a new gallery in the museum.

The museum in the developed form was inaugurated on May 22, 2009. It is open to the public from 10 am to 4-45 pm except Monday. Nearly 2000 visitors within and outside the state visited the museum last year.

A vocational training course for college students and local ladies on Art and Craft is run in the museum under the name "Aparajita". It runs a handicraft section for Batik, Embroidery, Fabric & Glass Painting. A Pre-primary Training Programme was started in September 2012 Certificates have been issued to successful students for the last three years. A vocational training course on First Aid and Nursing Course is running under Aparajita.

Folder, picture postcards, DVDs, CDs produced and published by the museum are on sale from the Museum Sales Counter. W.B. Tourism Department has included this museum in their city tour. The Museum is the pride of the college and a constant source of inspiration to teachers and students alike.
