38. Institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management

Rammohan College follows the practice of decentralization and participative management in academics, administration and extra-curricular activities. The GB is headed by the President, Govt. Nominees, and Members of the Higher education council, University Nominee, Principal, three Teachers' representatives, one non-teaching representative and one student representative. The GB looks after the strategic level issues related to quality of education, management and consultancy. The Principal works on the advice and active co-operation of the IQAC, Teachers' Council Secretary and different sub-committees delegated with distinct responsibilities.

Decentralization in academic matters

1) The IQAC proposes different policies for quality improvement in teaching-learning

2) An active role is also played by the Teachers' Council. It discusses different academic issues like examination, result consideration, attendance etc.

3) The Admission Committee and the Academic Sub-Committee conjointly shoulder the responsibility related to admission. The Routine Committee prepares the timetable by coordinating with each of the department. The Library Committee looks after the purchase, subscription, maintenance and upgradation of library facilities. The Sports Committee organizes Annual Sports.

4) The Departmental Head of each department maintains liaison with the Principal and other members of the departmental faculty.

39. Implementation of e-governance in areas of operation

The organogram of Rammohan College reflects the democratic character of governance. The organizational structure of the college consists of the Governing Body, the Principal, the Teaching Staff, the Non-Teaching Staff and the students. The Governing Body of the college under the leadership of the President discusses issues relating to finance, infrastructure, faculty recruitment and the matters related to the overall development of college. The Principal, as the chief administrator of the college, supervises and manages the overall functioning of the college. The Principal is assisted by the Departmental-in- Charges, the IQAC, the Teachers' Council and the Non -Teaching Staff which comprises of the Head Clerk, Accountant and Office Assistants. The Librarians also work with the Library Committee to upgrade academic resources and facilities in the library.

Teachers' appraisals are based on CAS. CAS for all teachers were assessed on the basis of academic, administrative activities of each teacher under the critical scrutiny of IQAC and finally recommended by the Governing Body for the approval of DPI, Govt. of West Bengal. Rammohan College has also maintained the attendance registered for the record of regular attendance, leave statement of teacher and their stipulated duty to conduct examination both internal and university examination. Appraisal of non-teaching staff is done by respective head of department, head clerk.

The College regularly makes arrangements for internal & external financial audits by concerned agencies. After completion of internal audit College send requisition for external auditor to the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal. However, audit of the PF for teaching & nonteaching staff for (Substantive posts) are regularly audited by external auditors.

41. Gender Equity (Number of gender equity promotion programmes organized by the Institution): 03

• Awareness campaign on 'Women's education' Brief description: The NSS Unit of Rammohan College arranged an awareness programme to aware the people on 'Women's education' on 22nd March, 2022. The campaign started from 2.30 pm. Total 15 volunteers and 2 teachers attended the campaign. The volunteers made several placards on this topic and also raised slogans during the campaign. They visited the slum of neighbouring area. They gathered the crowd and told them about the importance of women's education. This programme raised awareness among people in the slum area, also helped the volunteers in boosting their confidence. • Awareness programme on Gender inequality Brief description: On 25th March, 2022, Dr. Mehfuz Alam, Professor of Department of Education in Rammohan College had delivered a speech on gender inequality. Total 69 students and 8 teachers attended the programme. He stated how in this 21st century, gender inequality still exists in society. He also discussed about the possible reason behind this discrimination. He presented some examples like gender inequality in girls' education, that girls are more likely than boys to never set foot in classroom and be denied equal opportunities. He also stated how in most of the households, girl child is treated inferiorly than boy, how household works are mostly done by females etc. He then interacted with the students and students shared their experience, their views on the topic. The session ended with a note that gender discrimination must be stopped and all genders must be treated equally to make a progressive society and to achieve that, public awareness is very important.

• Awareness programme on 'Domestic Violence'. Brief description: The NSS Unit of Rammohan College arranged an awareness programme on 'Domestic Violence' at New Science building of Rammohan College on 25th March, 2022. Total 74 students and 8 teachers attended the programme. Dr. Rajib Saha was invited as chief guest in the programme. Dr. Rajib Saha is an assistant professor of department of Education at West Bengal University of Teachers' Training, Education Planning and Administration. The session started from 10 am in the morning. During this session, he discussed about different types or different forms of domestic violence, gave some statistics regarding the current status of domestic violence as well as the previous scenario. With people being educated over time, the number of cases has whether been increased or decreased etc. He also gave some suggestions to the NSS volunteers on what they should do, if they ever encounter any kind of domestic violence. After his speech, he interacted with the volunteers. The volunteers shared their views about the domestic violence that they have experienced at their home or at neighbour. At the end of the session, he called up the volunteers to be a responsible youth and stand against any form of domestic violence.

42. Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution

<u>Raja Rammohun Roy Memorial Museum</u>

1. Title of the Practice: Spread of Cultural Heritage: Rammohan Roy Memorial Museum [started in 2009-2010 and is a continuous process]

2. Objectives of the Practice: Raja Rammohan Roy (1772-1883), the great scholar, reformer and a leading figure in the 19th century Bengal Renaissance attempted to inspire and

modernize contemporary Indian society through social and educational reforms, particularly directed to the emancipation and empowerment of women. His adoption of the basic tenets of Sanatan Dharma gave rise to the Brahmo religion and Brahmo educationists played a significant role in educating and reforming society.

3. The context: The Museum was inaugurated on 22nd May 2009. The Govt of West Bengal and the Ministry of Culture, Govt of India have rendered financial assistance for the promotion and development of the museum. The Museum has also received financial assistance from the M.P.Lad fund.

4. The practice: Rammohan College acquired, renovated and restored the family residence of Raja Rammohan Roy at 85A, Raja Rammohan Roy Sarani, Kolkata 700009 for the purpose of converting the building into the Raja Rammohan Roy Memorial Museum. The Kolkata Municipal Corporation declared it as a heritage building.

5. Evidence of success: The Museum is dedicated to the social reformer Raja Rammohan Roy. There are six segments in the Museum – commemorative items, books, paintings and sketches, period furniture, panels and dioramas and death mask of Rammohan. Folder, picture post card, DVD, CD produced and published by the Museum are on sale from the Museum Sales Counter. The West Bengal Tourism Department has included the Museum in their City Tour. The Museum is regularly visited by the students of Rammohan College as well as by students of other colleges. MOUs with Victoria College, Vidyasagar Women's College and Bagbazar Women's College have been undertaken, to arrange for visits to the Museum.

6. Problems encountered and Resources Required: Financial Assistance is needed for expansion works including the setting up of galleries. Staff shortage is required to be settled. To protect the exhibits the Museum requires a centrally air-conditioned set-up.

<u>Medicinal Plant Garden</u>

1. Title of the Practice: Medicinal Plant Garden [started in 2010-2011 and is a continuous process]

2. Objectives of the Practice: The Medicinal Plant Garden displays more than 80 medicinal plants of our country with their vernacular name, scientific name, parts used and major medicinal uses. The major objective is to expose the students to the medicinal plant wealth of our country, which is one of the mega-diversity centres of the world.

3. The Context: Medicinal plants are mentioned in the Rig Veda, the oldest document, composed about 3500 years ago. The plants have been the chief source of drugs used in

treatment of various ailments. India is a repository of innumerable medicinal plants of immense value.

4. The Practice: More than 80 medicinal herbs and shrubs are grown in the garden. Periodically we arrange awareness programmes to motivate the students of different streams regarding the medicinal importance of plants, how to grow and propagate them and how one can easily identify them.

5. Evidence of Success: The display of Medicinal plants. Encouraging the students to develop the skill of precious identification of medicinally important plants. Our students have developed the skill. Most of the students grow a few medicinal plants in their kitchen garden or on the terrace.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required: Funds are required to procure more medicinal plants as well as for the maintenance of the garden. Another major problem is the lack of a skilled gardener cum plant scientist (phytologist) to add to the usefulness of the medicinal plant garden. At present, the teachers of the different departments, along with a gardener, take care of the garden, to the best of their ability.

15. The committees, staffs and cells are ample to meet the academic and non- academic requirements of the students.

16. The college is resorting to a green campus concept.

17. Security personal have been appointed

18. An inclusive system of Management was observed.

19. Office registers are up to date.

20. 1 Auditorium, 1 Open air-stage and 4 AC seminar halls with 60 seat capacity/ auditorium with audio visual facilities.

21.Teachers' room, students' union room, academic office rooms and some research laboratories provided with air conditioning facility.

22. Laboratory facilities in the old and new buildings are good.

23. Recently College has purchased few advanced instruments from RUSA and BOOST Grants.
