Course outCome (C.O.) of PG BenGali Course

CC – 1 (1st Semester) CC – 6 (2nd Semester)

History of Linguistics and Bengali Language

This course helps the students to gather knowledge about the origin of their mother language. Here we trace the chronological transformation of the 'Indo-European Language' to become the 'Ancient Indian Language' we know today. The students can learn the characteristics of ancient and medieval Indian Language and 'Neo Indian Language' from the course offered. They can gather their knowledge about linguistics, phonetics and international phonetics alphabets.

CC – 2 (1st Semester) CC – 7 (2nd Semester)

History of Socio-Cultural background on Bengali Literature

Present scenario is based on history. So, the students learn to appreciate their heritage and learn to respect their and ancestor's culture.

Pre-Modern Bengali Literature

Students can gather in-depth knowledge about the first evidence of Bengali literature 'Charjapada,' (which was written in pal era) to medieval literature to 18th century A.D. from this portion of syllabus. They can relate medieval literature with modern literature.

CC – 4 (1st Semester)

Modern Poetry

Students are benefited by learning the sequence of ideological changes from 19th century to 20th century in the poetries written by different poets with their different point of views and philosophy.

CC – 5 (2ndSemester)

Bengali Drama
Study of drama of 19th and 20th century inspires students to gather knowledge about different aspects of dramas, history of Bengali theatreand stage. The dramas are shown by projector, laptop to the students to give them insight about audio visual matter attachments with this course exposer to directors, actors, anchoring and eminent personalities of the theatre. This gives students the necessary tools to further use their talent and creativity in this field.

CC – 10 (1stSemester) CC – 12 (2ndSemester)

Tagore Literature

This course deals with the intensive and in-depth study of the Tagore's Literature. Rabindranath Tagore the First Nobel Laureate of India gives ideas, philosophy of life, idea about religion of man and innovative style of writing, so that students can be a good human being not only educationist with the touch of this type of literature.

Bengali Short Story

Essays and criticism of Eastern and Western Literal Theories

Manuscriptology

This topic helps students to read any inscriptions and manuscripts from ancient era. Gradually they can able to read the unread manuscripts and inscriptions which reveal the new history of socio-economic, religious, philosophical linguistic literary history of ancient India.
